Title II: all public entities at the local level (school district, municipal, city, or county), state level, and public transportation

Title III: business and non-profits: "equal enjoyment of the goods, services, facilities, or accommodations of any place of public accommodation" including most lodging (inns, hotels), recreation, transportation, **education**, dining, stores, care providers, places of public display
